Conversation Group: June 8th -18th Monday -Thursday 8:30-10:30 \$400

This group consists of clients and family members coping with the language and speech disorders caused by stroke and head injury. This group meets daily to encourage interaction/communication in a group dynamic. During each semester, clients select activities they enjoy and often work in teams to address these. In these groups members enjoy a sense of play, and how to foster a balance of interaction. Other traits encouraged are a sense of interdependency by sharing responsibility with each other. The group also goes out into the community to enjoy events and activities offered to the Boulder community as a whole, such as a visit to Celestial Seasonings Tea Co. and the Butterfly Pavilion. After such outings there is an opportunity to share personal experiences and information. On occasion the group also visits the campus sites and brown bag rehearsals offered by the University Theater and Music departments.

Community Art Studio: June 8th -18th , Monday-Thursday 2:15-4:15 \$0

The Community Art Studio is located at 63rd and Arapahoe and is located in the building of the Nalanda Campus of Naropa University. People are introduced to the many media offered to make art in an enjoyable community setting. The arts not only are the science of enjoying life but have been know to contribute significantly to the recovery from injury to the brain be it from stroke or head injury.

Writer's Workshop: June 22nd -25th , Monday-Thursday 11:45-1:45 \$200

The Writer's Workshop is an opportunity to engage in creative writing within a supportive community. These workshops have been held for three years as people with disabilities regain confidence and develop skills in writing. This work is not remedial but creative in nature.

Music Therapy June 22nd -25th , Monday-Thursday 2:15-4:15 \$200

Participants in Music Therapy learn to use music to develop higher cognitive skill such as attention to rhythm and pattern. It is felt that these skills support the development of communication skills. This is a playful environment to build listening skills as well as expressive skills within a supportive creative community. Music is felt to be a viable way to rewire the brain after certain types of damage resulting from stroke and head injury.

Personal Theatre June 22nd – July 2nd , Monday-Thursday 8:30-10:30 \$400

Personal Theatre is a multi-faceted approach to the art of acting, developed for the professional actor, which also works when used for general life performance. For the actor this process helps in integrating personal life with artistic work and professional goals. This process is also used in therapeutic settings and provides opportunities for stroke or head injured patients to maximize their existing communication skills. It is within the format of these workshops that clients find new ways of performing in both old and novel situations.
